Shedrick Williams, III was born May 3, 1952 in Miami, Florida to the late parents of Shedrick Williams, Jr. and Mother Missionary Mary Frances Bridges-Williams. He attended Miami Carol City Senior High School where he played the cello as a member of the jazz band. He furthered his Education at Miami-Dade College where he received an associate degree in commercial arts.

He met and married the late Ms. Christina Williams, and to this union, Shericka Williams was welcomed to the world, and they loved her dearly. Shedrick was a hard worker, working many years as a truck driver at FOAMEX. He was a master mechanic, an auto body repairer, aircraft painter, a man of many hats. He loved fishing, shooting pool, and won several billiard tournaments. He would often tell the story of meeting Dr. Ralph Abernathy, American Civil Rights Activist, having the opportunity to escort him in Chicago. Shedrick fought his battle against his failing health for many years. In his faith and belief in the Lord, he remained strong throughout. Despite being in constant pain, he never complained or lost his sense of humor. On June 20, 2023, just two months after the Lord called his mother home whom he loved

very much, Shedrick departed this life leaving to cherish his memories his only biological daughter Shericka Williams; son by marriage, Benjamin Stubbs; daughter by marriage, Donna Stubbs; Brother, Mark D.
