She found two parts of different trees and

carried them home and put the two sections together. The two throw away pieces became our Christmas tree that year. We had no clue of the lengths she took to get us a Christmas tree that year. This is just one of the many things she did to give us the best Christmas ever, year after year.

Apart from the great Christmases, Mom made sure we were dressed well, had gone to Catholic school and had a rich social life. We had gone to Radio City Music Hall, Classic Symphonies, the Opera, many museums, the zoo, everywhere! We never truly felt poor. We had a great life of riches with truly no money and resources. We were poorer than poor, but the things she did with so little, were true miracles. And the love was endless!

Everyone who was fortunate to know her was in awe of her kindness, sincere dedication to her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren - and her great sense of humor. She taught us strength, humility, sharing, trust and love in every depth possible.

We may no longer see her physically, but we'll always have our special memories of her in our hearts. We love her more than words could ever express and she will live in our hearts forever.
